
## Feltham History Group September 2023 meeting

**Chairs introduction**; Summer walks (July and August, September) resume + other?




In our occasional series 'a picture paints a thousand words' we have this very interesting picture, obviously taken from St Catherines Tower – from top left can be seen 'in far distance' tall Lombardy Poplar trees of the Bedfont Lane small holdings (1) including the old Piggery, which is todays Westmacott estate (2). Top centre Bedfont lane (3), which appears to have some kind of parade! In progress. Then the Locomotive Pub (4) and top right Blenheim Park (5) still a gravel pit – Left 'white building' Railway Tavern (6), and Concrete pedestrian steps (7), then Feltham Station Platform (8) with its slotted concrete panelled fence, (no station buildings) and the Longford River (9) 'note the allotments' (10) along its banks and bottom left the somewhat scruffy buildings was Feltham Ex-Servicemen's Club (11), behind which are the Alms Houses (12). The cars in the car park are 1940's, 1950's models. The street lamps are of the early 1960's, and bottom right 'roof' of the secret Feltham Rifle Club Building (13).


Feltham Station 175 years of service
