Election of Officers 2024/25

The *Chair dissolved the current committee and vacated his position and transferred control of the **mee**ting to the current Honorary Secretary, who subsequently called for nomination for <u>Chair</u> of the group for the coming year,

*NB the Chair of 28 years Roger Cowing made it clear that he no longer wished to stand.

<u>Election of Chair</u>, It was proposed by Angela Parton and Seconded by Ray Edwards – that Tony Fredjohn be elected to the post* - although not being proper procedure the following measure was taken to elect TF as per constitutional requirements to the somewhat care taker role, i.e. of '<u>Acting Chair'</u> until such time a member indicates an interest in undertaking the role of Chair.

Thereafter the newly elected Acting Chair took control of the meeting and called for nominations to the position of <u>Honorary Secretary</u>, as there was but one nominee 'Alan Rice' he being nominated by Jane Fredjohn and seconded by Chris Seymour was, following a vote, elected to the position. The Chair then dealt with the position of <u>Treasurer</u> for which 'again' only one nomination was forwarded, that being the current Treasurer Tony Fredjohn – the nomination came from Angela Parton and was seconded by Ray Edwards and as there was no other candidates a show of hands was requested and the said Tony Fredjohn was duly elected as Treasurer for fiscal year 2024/25

The position of <u>Vice Chair</u>, was next considered and produced but one candidate, i.e. Will Horgan, he being proposed by Jane Fredjohn and seconded by Mike Parsons, and following a show of hands produced an overwhelming response to the positive.

The position of <u>Assistant Secretary</u>, was next evaluated and as there was no other nominees the current holder of the position [Mike Dance] was re-elected in his absence – his absence was due to an illness.

<u>Assistant Treasurer</u>, the current holder of the position 'Roger Griffiths' being the only nomination was proposed by Roger Cowing and seconded by Angel Parton was, following a show of hands, re-elected to the position.

<u>Membership Secretary</u>, the role of Membership Secretary was then considered; the current holder indicated that he had no wish to continue in the role was thanked for his work and a nominee for his replacement was invited. There being but one nominee, i.e. Jane Fredjohn, who was proposed by Angela Parton and seconded by Ray Edwards, and following a show of hands, the said Jane Fredjohn was duly elected to the position.

Items of interest – there was but one matter under items of interest that being an email enquiry on the McClaren works in Feltham from a Mr Cooper

My response - Dear Mr Cooper

Sorry for the delay in responding but I have asked a number of local people regarding the 'McClaren works in Feltham, unfortunately little has come to light.

Belvedere Works, as the site was known, is today a 'high rise' block of the same name and whereas other buildings, in the area, bear names with local reference, none are in any way associated with McClaren. There are no references in any trade directories of McClaren or are there in telephone directories. Someone hinted that their time in Feltham was very short, '1950's' 18months

However, the Belvedere works were in Railway Terrace Feltham and they housed many small firms over the years, one being an 'Accumulator



works – battery charging etc -and a Ladder Factory plus, , Ivory Works but all were gone with the development of early 1960's - the whole High Street 'suffered' these are my words as a local historian who laments



the passing of all things of old 'c'est la vie'

We have a monthly local history meeting in April and I shall place it on the agenda so as to a hope that someone may know a little your enquiry The accompanying Ordnance survey maps show 'Belvedere works' which are of a fair size. The 1970 map image is of the works as they were 1965




 the people along the track side were standing in silent reverence to Winston Churchill's funeral train

*(Feltham Park is celebrating 100 years of pleasure this year. all areas, pre-1800, formed part of Feltham Common.)



AOB

There were two items under AOB, the first was from Angela Parton and concerned 'sale of land' at the 'soon to close' MOD land – it was reported by Angela Parton that during excavations an unusual amount of water

was found to be present in the sub structure- this appeared not to be associated with drainage but more a sub surface flow of water. The honorary Secretary responded with an insight as to research that he had entered into as to a <u>licence</u> being obtained by the occupants of a very old property 'pre The



Grange' from the Duke of Northumberland as to the supply of water for various purposes. This water was a 'cut' from the Crane River to the large mansion like houses now within the area of the MOD [see map]

Right of map 'blue' is a flow – additionally another flow or 'cut' is indicated via "track of stream" which fed a pond that was no longer in evidence along todays Forest Road but maps show a pond and an exit flow towards what is now noted as a 'Valve House' – this flow, apart feeding Hanworth Rectory eventually joins Feltham Brook near the roundabout of Feltham Brook Way. Further research is required!

One other AOB was provided by Mike Parsons who enlightened members as to one of the largest craft of the air Blackburn Beverely that had its initial production history at Feltham. Mike further spoke of the current 'home' of the last surviving 'kite' and that it was possible to visit the site.
